Time of registration: July, 31st 2009 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the nature lake of Pirna-Copitz, if the competitors are not registered at this time, a participation is not approved

Opening: July, 31st 2009 5:30 p.m. at the marketplace of Pirna

Classes: F2-A, F2-B, F2-C; F4-A, F4-B, F4-C; F 6; F 7; DS, NSS-A, NSS-B, NSS-C, NSS-D, seniors an juniors age-segregated

Juniors: all competitors that are not get 19 years old (age-group of 1991 and younger) by December ,31st 2009 start as juniors

Number of competitors: every national federation of ship modeling sport can delegate 5 seniors and 5 juniors as competitors of the world championship. **The world champion (Sankt Petersburg) can start additionally in every class**.

At every junior class must be registered at least 6 competitors of 3 countries, otherwise it will not be assigned the title of the world champion. An international competition then will take place only. In every senior class must be registered at least 10 competitors of 5 countries, otherwise it will not be assigned the title of the world champion. An international competition then will take place only.

There must be registered **at least 4 teams / competitors of at least 2 countries** in the classes **F6** and **F7**.

Conditions of the world championship: NAVIGA NS 2006 with adjustments of November, 10th 2007 concerning starting fees and changes in class NSS

Conditions of participation: completed registration transmitted by the national federation of ship modeling sport, payment of all starting fees an time, individual insurance policy and punctual registration of each model at the nature lake of Pirna-Copitz.

Frequencies: class F 2/DS: 27 MHz; channels 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 19, 40 MHz; channels 51, 52, 55, 59, 83, 85, 87, 88, 89, 92

class F4: 27 MHz; channels 4, 7, 8, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 40 MHz; channels 50, 53, 54, 57, 58, 81, 82, 84, 86, 90, 91 **class F 6, F7, NSS:** all channels

Attention: At the frequencies of 27 MHz may occur disturbances from time to time. Transceivers with 2.4 GHz are admitted.

Security advice: Attendance is at one's own risk. The insurance policy needs to conclude by every competitor himself and must be transmitted along with the application in copy! Means of transport are not provided.

Flags and anthem: Each national federation hands over 3 national flags (about 100×150 cm) and a CD or audio cassette with the national anthem to the organizer.

Awards:	1 st place: title of world champion in ship modeling sport, cup 1 st – 3 rd place: medal and certificate Each competitor will obtain a certificate
catering:	at and around the competition place, for competitors of the world championship only.
